CULTURAL DIRECTOR FEB 2018

It is with great pleasure that I accept the role of Cultural Director for Leif Erickson Lodge. I'd like to take a few paragraphs to introduce myself. I am originally from Seattle, and have also lived in Chicago, Washington, DC, and New York City. After traveling around the country, it's great to be home!

I believe my work history has prepared me somewhat for the position, but I look forward to learning from all the extremely capable past Cultural Directors. My work history includes about ten years in the museum field. I have a Masters Degree in Museum Studies and have worked or volunteered at MOHAI, EMP Museum (now MoPOP), National Archives and Records Administration, and the Nordic Heritage Museum (NHM). I have Swedish heritage, and working at NHM introduced me to the Nordic Community here in Seattle. I had some wonderful experiences as Registrar at NHM. The Registrar in a museum is part record-keeper, part community liaison, part object handler, and part knowledge keeper, to name a few aspects of the job. Central to the role of Registrar at NHM is building the collection. With the Collections Committee, I reviewed many items offered to the museum by the community. I learned a lot about folk art, fine art, traditional costumes, and local Nordic Heritage organizations. I always loved sharing the collection with the staff, volunteers, and audience of the museum through exhibits. I hope that as Cultural Director you will see the enthusiasm that I have for sharing Nordic culture. I look forward to serving you in 2018!

LEIKARRINGEN OF LEIF ERIKSON LODGE 2



Leikarringen of Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001 has been sponsored by this lodge for almost 60 years! Started informally by Norwegian immigrants at a birthday party at Lila Granaas' house in August of 1959, it was formally organized on February 19, 1960. Mary Viken was the founder of our group. (She is the mother of Christine Robel (LEL and Norway Park Board). The purpose of our group is to learn and perform the folk songs, music, and dances of Norway. We are the only Nordic dance group in the Seattle area specializing in these Norwegian traditions. Now, while many in our group are of Norwegian or Scandinavian descent, it is open to all.

Our name means a group of folk dancers from Leif Erikson Lodge 2-001. In the photo, we are at Norse Home, where we dance and visit every December! We perform throughout the year at private, lodge, and community functions, including Norwegian Constitution Day, known as *Syttende Mai*, in Ballard; occasionally at Northwest Folklife Festival at Seattle Center in May; Skandia Folkdance Society's annual *Midsommarfestin* June; at the Nordic Museum in November at Yulefest and NordicFest on Whidbey Island; and travel down to Portland's Scanfair in December.

Members of Leikarringen maintain frequent contact with the folk dancing community in the Scandinavian countries to continue to improve our dancing and learn new methods of teaching. Several of our members have done reverse immigration and now reside in Norway, Ingrid Hamberg, a former LEL queen, and Chris and Terryanne Reinert. Chris and Terryanne met in Leikarringen and eventually married as many in our group have done. Their love of Norwegian dance and music continued on in Norway. They return on a regular basis and even had their folkdancing group, Leikarringen i Haug BU, here as instructors for Norsk Folkedans Stemne. Stemne is an annual event planned by members of Leikarringen and others. We currently are meeting in August at Fort Worden. We try to have dancers and musicians from Norway every year or

nationally known instructors from the United States.

Bergljot Ringset Roswick was the first president of Leikarringen of Leif Erikson Lodge in 1960. She was also our dance director for many years. Her love of Norwegian songdances has been passed down for generationsthroughLeikarringenandBarneleikarringen. Barneleikarringen, for young dancers and their families, was started many years ago. It now continues on Sunday afternoons. Please read more about them in this newsletter!

We are always looking for new dancers. We meet every Tuesday from 7:30PM-9:30PM in the auditorium. Larry Reinert serves as our current dance director. Instruction takes place every week. Experienced dancers will help you learn the dances in no time! The first practice of the month is our party night with potluck refreshments. We have several loaner costumes if you would like to perform with us!

If you have a love of Norwegian culture and heritage, this is the place to learn more about costumes, dance, music, history, songs, and more!
