Christine Anderson Award Ethnic Heritage Council's Annual Membership Dinner Leif Erikson Lodge

Every year, the Ethnic Heritage Council's annual membership dinner is held at various ethnic clubs, organization, community centers or museums. For the first time, this event is being held at the Leif Erikson Lodge. The annual dinner celebrates the ethnic diversity that enriches our community.

Each year, the Council honors two individuals who have contributed to the ethnic community. This year, Christine Anderson will be given the Pulaski Award that recognizes an individual who has contributed significantly to a Northwest ethnic community and the community-at-large through efforts to preserve, document, or present that community's culture as part of the ethnic experience in the Pacific Northwest. As many of you know, Christine has worked for years documenting and promoting Norwegian culture and keeping the Leif Erikson Lodge full of activities. In addition, through her efforts, the Lodge now has enough funds to begin to work on making much needed repairs. Christine will receive a well-deserved award.

The Gordon Ekvall Tracie Award recognizes an ethnic performing artist for excellence in ethnic performance and for his or her contributions to the development and presentation of traditional cultural arts in the Pacific Northwest. This year's well deserved winner is Harvey Niebulski. Harvey, who is an MD, has been instrumental in promoting Jewish traditions and customs through music and song. Dr. Niebulski has

been an active member of the Folk Life board and is instrumental in organizing the popular "Big Jewish Show" at the festival. He has worked tirelessly throughout the years sharing Jewish traditions and customs through music and song. As so many people have stated, "Harvey is a real musical treasure!"

Since the event is at our Lodge, a full course Norwegian dinner will be served with several main course, various salads, homemade rolls, vegetarian options and, of course, delicious Norwegian desserts. Wine, beer and soft drinks will also be available.

Folk Voice with six musicians will be playing international music along with Nordic tunes. Klez Katz will get the place jumping with lively klezmer tunes. Norwegian Male Chorus

NORWEGIAN MALE CHORUS OF SEATTLE

In 1889, the year that Washington was admitted to statehood, nineteen Norwegians got together in Seattle and founded "Nordmennenes Sangforening." The name has since been Americanized and the chorus is now known as The Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle. The purpose of the organization, as stated in its by-laws, is to promote and cultivate vocal music and dramatic art and especially to foster and promote Nordic songs and music.

In over 100 years of existence, the chorus has had many directors. Those who contributed the most include Rudolph Moller who directed for 29 years, Professor August Werner who directed for 33 years, and Dr. Alf Knudsen who directed for 29 years. G. Robert Johnston had the baton for nine years and our current director is Julie Parsons.

The Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle is considered the oldest continuously active chorus in Seattle. It has been a vital part of Seattle's musical life over the past century, from participating in the 1909 Alaska Yukon Exposition to a Scandinavian Night with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra in 1975. We currently rehearse at Our Redeemers Lutheran Church in Ballard and then perform at various events. But, the most important event of the year is the annual Sangerfest when all the Norwegian Male Choruses up and down the coast, from San Diego to Bellingham gather for a singing festival. There have been many Sangerfests held in Seattle and though each is hailed as being better than the preceding one, it is generally conceded that the 1951 Sangerfest was especially outstanding. On that occasion 200 singers performed in concert, outside under a bright full moon, at the Green Lake Aqua Theater to an enthusiastic audience of over 5000. Lauritz Melchior was guest soloist and he captivated the audience with his stage personality as well as with his beautiful voice. The 1989 Centennial Sangerfest was another highlight. Being the centennial year, the Seattle chorus invited Norwegian Male Choruses from all over the United States as well as Norway. Almost 500 singers, including 100 from Norway, were on stage at the Washington State Convention and Trade Center. This year we will be in Poulsbo, with the Grand Concert on Saturday June 23rd at the Clearwater Casino Event Center.

Our membership is currently around 30 and we are always looking for more men who like to sing. It is not required that you be Norwegian. Greetings from the 2018 District 2 Nominating Committee!!

With the approach of the 2018 District convention in May, a new nominating committee has begun the process of vetting nominees for 2018-2020 officers. There are some offices which are definitely being vacated because those officers have reached their term limits, but nominations are accepted for all offices. Those being vacated for term limits are Publicity/Social Director, Youth Director, and Sports Director. The other positions open for nominations include President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Cultural/Foundation Director. Nominations will also be accepted for the position of International Director Alternate, who will serve in the event that International Director Mark Agerter is unable to continue for some reason.

If you are interested in running for any of the District offices, you must 1) be a benefits member or be willing to purchase a product, 2) be vetted by the nominating committee BEFORE the convention, and 3) be registered as a delegate to the convention. The best way

Completed application forms must be submitted no later than 30 days before the convention, but you are encouraged to submit earlier to facilitate the process. Interviews will be conducted with all applicants, to be arranged later. Zone Directors are elected by their individual zones during the zone caucuses at the convention. We do know that at least Zones 1,3, and 5 will need new Directors, perhaps more. No advance applications are required to run for Zone Director from your zone. Please keep these offices in mind as possibilities.

Obituaries

Alma Lilleskare died on February 11, 2018, at the age of 95. She joined the Lodge in 1968 and became a Life Member in 1998. She was born in Bergen, Norway, and passed away in Bellevue, Washington. The Memorial will go to the Union Gospel Mission.

Veletta M. Linville died on August 31, 2017, at the age of 87½. She joined the Lodge in 1987 and was a Golden Member. She is survived by her husband Harvey. The Memorial will go to the Leif Erikson Educational Association.

Hans G. Tofting died on February 26, 2018, at the age of 90. Hans became a member of the Sons of Norway in 1998 and transferred to the Lodge in 2004. He was born in Bergen, Norway as one of five children. He survived the German occupation of Norway during his teenage years and joined the Norwegian Army after WWII, serving a tour in Germany, and then immigrated to the United States in 1951. He was a commercial painter for many years, but his hobby was creating oil paintings of beautiful scenery. Hans enjoyed the Scandinavian community and even worked in Kaffestua.
